# Message from the Board Chair & Executive Director

### **Challenges and Adversity**

As we began to emerge from the COVID-19 pandemic, a second wave impacted the community of Chatham-Kent. This past year, Linck Child, Youth and Family Supports has been called to support children and youth in ways like no other. With a lack of the rapeutic treatment options for youth with complex care needs and histories of trauma, the agency has had to secure alternate living accommodations as well as open our doors to shelter and protect the most vulnerable youth in Chatham-Kent.

Over the past year, Linck has been providing direct care to several youth in the community. Our building has been used as a temporary home and our multidisciplinary team have been called to provide staffing coverage during these times of crisis. This has meant filling around-the-clock shifts in addition to their regular work. It has been exhausting and stressful. We want better for all kids across Ontario. Continuous advocacy efforts have strengthened the cross-sector collaboration

between child and youth mental health and child welfare to increase responsiveness to youth with complex needs. We stand with families in their efforts to have safe, responsive care for their child.

Linck staff across all mandates continue to show up and deliver supports that are child and youth focused and responsive to the urgency of presenting needs. This care continues to align with our four strategic goals.

### **Our Continued Commitment**

In November, the doors to the Linck/ YMCA Childcare opened. This community collaboration included the Municipality, YMCA and Linck to increase the accessibility and professional childcare support to the community of Chatham-Kent.

Our Developmental Services team (Early Developmental Support workers or

EDSWs) grew exponentially in response to special needs resourcing requests from municipal childcare centers. The department's commitment to inclusion, collaboration, and diverse abilities is stronger than ever!

All Child and Family Consultants began a journey of discovery about the Early Childhood Coaching philosophy. Through 2023/24 we will continue to learn and partner with all our clients through a coaching lens.

Everything that Linck does, the big and the small, happens because of the committed and compassionate staff that show up every day to serve the children, youth and families of Chatham-Kent. We compel ourselves to ask - how does what I do make things better for children and youth. Through the challenges, the Linck team does not waver in the commitment to excellent service and improved outcomes for kids and families. It is because of the commitment of the

collective Linck team that we can show up every day to provide support. When one of us struggles, there is someone else alongside to pick up and continue the journey.

This is our strength as a multi-service, interdisciplinary team. Our Mission- Strong connections for a better future, grounds us in our work and our continued commitment to serve and improve outcomes for children, youth and families in the community of Chatham-Kent.



Throughout 2022-2023 Linck has enacted initiatives directly aimed towards fulfilling the strategic plan.






#### Timely Access to the Right Support

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# Looking Back

### One Stop Talk Partnership

The years of isolation due to the pandemic have magnified the long-standing mental health crisis in Canada. More than ever, children and youth are facing increasingly difficult mental health challenges, yet finding needed mental health supports is a challenge itself. One of the largest barriers to children and youth seeking out mental health services is accessibility; accessing mental health services can be both cost prohibitive and services can be difficult to navigate.

As part of our commitment to timely access to the right supports for our community, Linck has partnered with

One Stop Talk/Strides Toronto on the launch of Parlons maintenant.

One Stop Talk is an online service which provides free and immediate access to single session mental health services to children and youth within 18 years of age – connecting children and youth to a team of certified therapists who provide culturally-sensitive and caring support.

One Stop Talk/Parlons maintenant became available to Linck clients on March 6th of 2023 before becoming available Ontariowide on May 1st to coincide with the first day of the Canadian Mental Health Association's Mental Health Week.







Through partnerships with organizations like Linck, One Stop Talk/Parlons maintenant will deliver a consistent, accessible approach to services and empower children and youth to seek out the mental health support they need.

#### **YMCA-Linck Childcare**

In September of last year, Linck Child, Youth and Family Supports and the YMCA of Southwestern Ontario, along with the Municipality of Chatham-Kent opened the doors of a new childcare facility for the community of Chatham-Kent. The YMCA-Linck Childcare Facility currently provides childcare services for up to 50 children and provides employment opportunities for up to 20 staff.


