Linck serves the children and families of the Chatham-Kent Municipality and includes child protection, children's mental health, child development and prevention.

Linck is an accredited multiservice agency that responds to the unique dynamics of our families. We support the well-being and safety of our children and their families through evidence-based practices and collaboration with community partners. Together, Linck employees strive to foster an environment that encourages positive growth, professional development and progressive change.

Chatham-Kent has a population in excess of 110,000 and is ideally situated mid-way between Windsor and London on the shores of Lake Erie. Linck Child, Youth & Family Supports ("Linck" or the "Agency") requires two (2) Child Protection Case Aides. These are contract positions working 35 hours per week, beginning in May 2024, and lasting 8 weeks.

The incumbent(s) will observe and shadow ongoing child protection workers. They will participate in supervised and monitored access visits; take children and families to community activities and appointments; attend low risk visits to client homes; look up resources and copy materials for the child protection workers to use with clients on a variety of topics; complete forms and letters in draft form for Child Protection Workers; and other duties as required to support the work of Child Protection Workers.

Qualifications:

- between 15 and 30 years of age (inclusive) at the start of employment per grant funding requirements;
- lived experience as a recipient of child protection services would be considered an asset;
- attainment of, or progression towards post-secondary education of a Bachelor of Social Work (BSW), Master of Social Work (MSW), or a Bachelor (Honours) in a related field of study;
- ability and willingness to work as an integral member of a team;
- good oral and written communication skills;
- strong time management skills;
- the ability to communicate in French is an asset;
- preference will be given to persons with a strong understanding and extensive experience working with other cultures, heritages and traditions;
- a commitment to developing the highest quality culturally-appropriate service possible for the various communities that we serve; and
- a valid driver's license.
