Linck Child, Youth & Family Supports ("Linck") requires one (1) **Resource Worker**. This is a full-time (70 hour bi-weekly) contract position beginning as soon as possible and lasting for 6 (six) months.

The Resource Worker provides a variety of services related to the support of foster parents. Services related to the orientation, training and approval process for those individuals interested in providing foster care for a child/youth. He/she provides services related to the selection and placement of a child/youth in a foster care home upon the request of another social worker.

- Four-year Honours Bachelors degree (BA); Bachelor of Social Work degree (BSW); or Indigenous degree would be an asset

- completion of training in PRIDE curriculum and SAFE home study tool is an asset

- knowledge of dynamics of separation and attachment between parent figures and children/youth
